8. IN EVENT OF DISTRESS OR ACCIDENT

Australian Sailing strongly recommends:

- (a) The crew stay with the boat at all times while the boat is capsized.
- (b) The use of the following signals to indicate that assistance is needed:
 - (i) Crew in boat:

Either both arms raised above the head and lowered to the sides cyclically at 5-second intervals, or a flag or other object, on a spar waved from side to side through an arc of 30 degrees either side of the vertical, cyclically at 5-second intervals.

(ii) Crew in water:

One arm raised above the head for three seconds at 5-second intervals.

- (c) When a boat is in difficulty with its sails lowered, some highly visible article, such as an orange or yellow garment, should be hoisted on a halyard to aid visibility to rescue craft.
- (d) Crews should call for assistance before becoming exhausted.





Special Regulations Part 2 – Off the Beach Boats

- Boats must be in good, seaworthy condition.
- Centreboards, rudders, etc securely fastened to the hull by lanyard or other effective measure.
- Sailors should be aware of how to attach or use a tow line. Tow line passed from safety boat, sailor to wrap twice around mast and then hold tail while steering.
- Hull identification must be located externally on transom or both outboard sides of the hull. Name, sail number, BYS.
- Lifejackets must be worn, in good condition.
- Check your gear and equipment before going on the water.
- Be mindful of swimmers.
- Trapezeing sailors should carry a knife.



Safety reminders

Special Regs 1.02 – Responsibility of the person in charge

1.02 RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PERSON IN CHARGE

The safety of a boat and its crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility 1.02.1 of the person in charge who shall do their best to ensure that the boat is fully found, thoroughly seaworthy and manned by an experienced crew who have undergone appropriate training and are physically fit to face bad weather. They must be satisfied as to the soundness of hull, spars, rigging, sails and all gear. They shall ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained and stowed and that the crew know where it is kept and how it is to be used. Attention is drawn to Regulation 2.04 that specifies the crew experience required for some races. They shall also nominate a person to take over the responsibilities of the person in charge in the event of his incapacitation.





RRS 3 – Decision to race

3 DECISION TO RACE

The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue <u>racing</u> is hers alone.





NOR 16 – Insurance

16. INSURANCE

16.1. Each participating boat must be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10,000,000 per incident or the equivalent, and the insurance must be valid for each race.

NOR 4.5 & 4.6 – Sail Pass

- Non-members must have a Sail Pass: www.bys.asn.au/sailpass
- 4.5. All skipper and crew shall be either a financial member of BYS with racing rights or comply with BYS's Sail Pass scheme. BYS Social members may enter a maximum of four races as a crew each membership year.
- 4.6. Non-members shall apply for a BYS Sail Pass here: www.bys.asn.au/sailpass Fees apply.





- Non-members can apply for a Sail Pass advance.
- First six Sail Passes are free, second six Sail Passes are \$15.
- Encourage visiting sailors to join the club.
- Visiting OTB sailors will also sign on and off – paper sheet.

Sail Pass is a temporary day membership that lets non-members join the crew of a competing yacht on race day. It includes access to our club facilities, an Australian Sailing number, and personal accident insurance for the day.

Registration is quick and simple, and you can access up to 12 Sail Pass visits in total. Your first six visits are free, with the next six available at just \$15 per visit.







- Everyone should have at least 2 duties
- Some generous members have offered to be rostered as often as weekly
- If you are unable to complete a rostered duty, please find someone to fill in then notify Maria in the Sailing Office
- Its is up to <u>you</u> to find a replacement
- Sign on for duty via the Sailing Hub





- Principal Race Officer (PRO) replaces Officer of the Day (OOD).
- Updated to reflect common terminology, and better describe the role.
- The PRO supports the Course Race Officer/s (CRO) from shore, and is the Incident Controller in an emergency situation.
- The PRO will provide race management from shore where there is no course race officer rostered.
- A CRO has complete control of their course area unless an incident is escalated to an emergency situation.





- When two start boats are on the water, two VHF channels will be used
- Keelboats and sportsboats will remain on VHF 71
- Check the allocated VHF channel at volunteer briefing!





- Requesting fleet leaders from each class.
- Meet with RO and help deliver a competitor briefing each race day.
- Welcome new sailors/boats, weather, special news.
- Opportunity for newer sailors to ask questions.
- In Junior Lounge at whiteboard.
