1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028 ('RRS').
- 1.2 The Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 2 For Off the Beach Boats, shall apply.
- 1.3 Appendix T, Arbitration of RRS will apply.
- 1.4 A boat may receive outside help where the Race Committee deems that the vessel and its crew require assistance in order to right a capsized vessel in order to continue racing. This changes Rule 41, RRS.

2 ADVERTISING

2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organising Authority. Details will be supplied at registration.

3. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all four the three RS Aero classes (5/6/7/9) whose skipper is a current financial member of a club affiliated with Australian Sailing and a member of the RS Aero Class Association of Australia.
- 3.2 Entries received before 11.59pm on 14 February 2025 are eligible for the early bird fee of \$80. Entries received after this date are \$120. Regatta entry closes at 5pm on 24 February 2035
- 3.3 The online entry shall be submitted at: https://bys.asn.au/2025-rs-aero-victorian-championships/
- 3.4 The specific Aero class (rig size) needs to be specified on entry. However, the nominated class (rig size) can be changed at time of registration.
- 3.5 If a competitor wishes to change classes during the regatta (and therefore have a new entry), they will inform the Race Committee at least one hour before the first warning signal for the race affected by the change of rig. The new entry will be covered by their original entry fee. Only one change of class will be permitted, and the new rig will then be used for the remainder of the championship. The score for all previous races with the new rig will be DNC. The score for all subsequent races with the original rig will be DNC.

4. SCHEDULE

- 4.2 No warning signal will be made after 1600 hrs on Sunday 2nd March 2025.
- 4.3 The series will comprise a maximum of six (6) races.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

6 VENUE

6.1 The racing area shall be on Port Phillip in the vicinity of the BYS

7 THE COURSES

7.1 The courses to be sailed will be of a trapezoid configuration as described in the sailing instructions.

8 PENALTY SYSTEM

8.1 RRS rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

CLASSES AND DIVISIONS

9.1 There will be a separate start for each of the Aero class sizes, providing there is a minimum of 6 entries to the class

10 SCORING

- 10.1 Six (6) races are scheduled of which three (3) are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.2 When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 10.3 When five (5) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

11 TROPHIES

- 11.1 Trophies will also be awarded according to each Aero classes entry numbers. A minimum of 3 boats per class will be required for the awarding of a 1st prize in that class. A minimum of 4 boats per class will be required for the awarding of a 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes in that class.
- 11.2 Further prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the organising authority.

12 SUPPORT BOATS

- 12.1 Support boats shall register for the event by 24 February 2025 at: https://sailingresults.net/entry/default.aspx?ID=1064561
- 12.2 All support boats must carry a working VHF radio able to be tuned to the regatta channel as well as be prepared to assist the Race Committee if requested to do so until cleared to leave the course area.
- 12.3 At no time during racing shall a support boat go closer than 100 metres to a boat that is racing or impede it in any way whatsoever unless already participating in a rescue or unless directed to do so by the Race Committee.
- 12.4 When the Race Committee display flag V with repetitive sounds, all official and support boats shall monitor the Race Committee radio channel for search and rescue instructions. (Refer to RRS 37)

13 BERTHING

- 13.1 Boats and trailers are left at the club and surrounding beach area, and any designated trailer park, at the owner's risk.
- 13.2 All trailers may be stored in the areas provided by the organising authority at the owner's risk.
- 13.3 Boats may be dropped off at the club prior to the event on or after: 22/2/25

14 RADIO COMMUNICATION

14.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones and any form of GPS device.

14.2 No electronic device which could be used to increase boat speed or gain a tactical advantage shall be attached to a boat or carried by a crew member, other than (a) time keeping devices, (b) digital compasses provided these cannot calculate speed or location information for use while racing and (c) Tack Tracker type devices that record data relating to the position of a boat but do not permit any visual display of that data to a crew member during the race.

15 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

15.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk see RRS 3, Decision to Race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

16 INSURANCE

16.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of AUD \$10,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

16.2 Competitors may be required to produce evidence of such insurance and any competitor not holding such cover shall withdraw their entry.

17 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

17.1 In participating in the regatta, a competitor automatically grants the Organising Authority, the Association and the sponsors of the regatta, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproduction of him/her during the period of the competition for the said regatta in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the said regatta without compensation.
